Re: Correctional Managed Health Care Policy Manual Updates

Listed below is an updated policy for your Correctional Managed Health Care Policy Manual. The Facility Management Team is expected to inform all employees of these policies before placing them in the manual.

Policy Number	Policy Name	Primary Change
A-08.2	Transfers of Offenders With Acute Conditions	Section II was changed to clarify that a provider determines the level of care and the mode of transportation when an offender is transported. The role of Utilization Management/Review in a non-urgent situation was clarified (Section IV). It was decided the steps for transferring emergent or life-threatening cases should be listed before non-urgent cases.
A-08.6 and Attachments A, B	Medically Recommended Intensive Supervision (MRIS) Screening	Revisions were made for the MRIS application process to include a screening form (Attachment A) in addition to the summary form (Attachment B).
E-31.2 and Attachment B	Organ or Tissue Donation	This policy now has instruction to scan Attachment A (Tissue and Organ Donor Form) into the EMR each time it is completed by an offender. Attachment B (Retraction of Tissue and Organ Donor Status) was added to this policy and details for processing the new attachment were included under Section II (Attachment B also is to be scanned into the EMR and would automatically deactivate Attachment A in the EMR.
G-55.1	Pregnant Offenders	Section VII was moved to be included with Section VI and a revised Section VII now requires all units to report spontaneous abortions and fetal deaths (stillbirths) to HSL.
G-57.1	Sexual Assault	Updates were applied to this policy bringing it to date with PREA Standards. Section V provides instructions for offering pregnancy tests that details the steps to take if the test is negative or positive. Section VI has changes that instruct specific time lines to be followed to have the offender seen by mental health professionals.
I-70.1	Informed Consent	The references were updated.
