RE: Attorney Submission, Presentation of Evidence, and Parole Status Inquiries

Texas Administrative Code 141.60 provides specific directions on the submission of information and arguments in support of an offender. It reads as follows:

- (a) Unless otherwise authorized, information and arguments in support of an offender shall be in writing.
- (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this rule, all information and arguments in support of an offender's release shall be submitted at any time to the Review and Release Processing Section-TDCJ, Austin, Texas.
- (c) When an offender's case is in the review period, copies of all information and arguments in support of an offender's release may be submitted to members of the parole panel designated to consider the case.
- (d) For the purpose of this rule, the review period shall be greater than two months but less than six months prior to the month of the next schedule review period.

Additionally, attorneys who wish to present information on behalf of an offender may request an interview only when the offender's case is within the review period. Requests for interviews should be in writing and pertain to a single offender. Multiple offender interview requests on one letter/e-mail will not be accepted. Separate emails are required for each offender submission. All supporting documentation must be received by the appropriate Board Office of jurisdiction **no later than three business days** prior to the scheduled interview. You may submit correspondence and documentation directly to the board office assigned to the offender's case through the dedicated email address. Please see the Contact Information section on the BPP Website for the office email address. Once received, a response will be provided. The duration of each interview is limited to 20 minutes.

Status information with respect to an offender's parole eligibility date, most recent or last consensus vote can be obtained under Inmate Search/Parole Review Information on the following Texas Department of Criminal Justice Website: www.tdcj.texas.gov/bpp or by contacting the Board of Pardons and Paroles Call Center at 1-844-512-0461. Board offices should not be contacted to check the status of an offender. Your compliance is appreciated.
