BOARD DIRECTIVE

SUBJECT: CONDITIONS OF PAROLE

PURPOSE: To establish a procedure for the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles to impose and/or modify conditions of parole for a person transferred from the Texas Juvenile Justice Department to the Texas Department of Criminal Justice Parole Division.

AUTHORITY: Texas Government Code Sections 508.035(d) and 508.156
Board Directive BPP-DIR.141.304
Texas Family Code Section 53.045 and 54.04(d)(3)
Texas Human Resource Code Sections 245.051(c) and 245.151(e)

DISCUSSION: Upon reaching their 19th birthday, a person serving a determinate sentence in a Texas Juvenile Justice Department (TJJD) facility or on TJJD parole must either be released on parole for supervision by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice (TDCJ) Parole Division (Division) or transferred to the TDCJ Correctional Institutions Division.

The TJJD shall approve the parole of any person in a TJJD facility for supervision by the Division and the transfer of persons from TJJD parole to the Division. Additionally, in some instances, a juvenile court judge will order a person's release on parole for supervision by the Division. In either case, prior to the person's release on parole, a parole panel may impose any reasonable condition of parole that the parole panel may impose on an adult inmate.

DEFINITIONS: Victim – as defined by Article 56A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure and entitled to notification pursuant to Article 56A.506, Code of Criminal Procedure.

Close relative of a deceased victim – as defined by Article 56A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure and entitled to notification pursuant to Article 56A.506, Code of Criminal Procedure.

Guardian of victim – as defined by Article 56A.001, Code of Criminal Procedure and entitled to notification pursuant to Article 56A.506, Texas Code of Criminal Procedure.

Person from the Texas Juvenile Justice Department – a child sentenced to commitment in a TJJD facility with a possible transfer to the TDCJ in accordance with the provisions of the Texas Family Code.

TJJD parole panel – a panel of the Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles as designated by the Presiding Officer to serve as the TJJD panel.

PROCEDURE:

I. Transmittals

- A. The TJJD parole panel shall receive a transmittal and supporting documents from the Division requesting the imposition or modification of conditions of parole for a person from the TJJD. The parole panel may impose any condition of release as identified by the statute or Texas Board of Pardons and Paroles (Board) policy.
- B. The TJJD parole panel may receive a transmittal from TDCJ Victim Services Division providing new and relevant information from correspondence or any communication that was not in the file at the time of the most recent parole panel action or not previously subject to review by the TJJD.
- C. New and relevant information shall be categorized and labeled as: Victim Information or Other Information.
 - 1. Victim Information – information from a victim, guardian of a victim, or close relative of a deceased victim.
 - 2. Other Information – new and relevant information received from any source other than those identified in Section I.B. above.

- II. Transmittal Review – The TJJD parole panel shall review all transmittal requests to impose or modify conditions of parole for a person from the TJJD. When the TJJD parole panel completes their vote, the transmittal and the case file will be returned to the Division. The TJJD will coordinate the release or transfer of the person from the TJJD with the Division.
