RE: FY22 Funding Summary

District and County Court Judges Trying Criminal Cases,

The Texas Department of Criminal Justice-Community Justice Assistance Division (TDCJ-CJAD) has released FY22 funding amounts for community supervision and corrections departments (CSCD). In summary, the statewide biennial appropriations are as follows:

- Basic Supervision (BS) funding decreased by approximately \$6.6 million (4.8%) based on population projections; however, TDCJ-CJAD is tracking statewide actual FY2022 misdemeanor placements and average felony directs. In the event cases exceed current funding levels, TDCJ will engage with the Texas Legislative offices to resolve any differences.
- Community Corrections (CC) funding, Diversion Program (DP) funding, and Treatment Alternatives to Incarceration Program (TAIP) funding remained at FY20-21 appropriation levels.
