Associate of Applied Science, Business Management – Technical degree with a minimum of 15 hours of academic courses. Only academic Texas Common Core courses will transfer towards a bachelor's program.

Bachelor's degree program –

Bachelor of Science in Sociology – A 120-hour, academic degree.

College Funding: Please select the type of funding you anticipate using to pay for the academic/career and technical education courses. Below are various funding methods available:

- Direct Pay** – Payment of tuition fees paid directly to the college or university by an outside source (e.g., family member, friend).
- Hazlewood Benefits** – The Hazlewood Act is a State of Texas benefit that provides qualified Veterans, spouses, and dependent children with an education benefit of up to 150 hours of tuition exemption, including most fee charges, at public institutions of higher education in Texas. Student will be required to provide copy of DD-214 for verification.
- I-25** – Payment of tuition fees with an I-25 from student's Inmate Trust Fund.
- Pell Grant** – Pell eligibility is determined by completion of the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To be Pell-eligible, the applicant must demonstrate exceptional financial need, be a U.S. citizen or an "eligible noncitizen," pursue a degree or certificate in an approved program, and not have earned a bachelor's, graduate or professional degree. Pell Grants do not have to be repaid. Not all postsecondary institutions accept Pell Grants.
- Postsecondary Education Reimbursement** – No upfront tuition fees. Postsecondary expenses incurred shall be repaid upon reentry. Upon reentry, if amount owed cannot be paid, a monthly payment plan can be established with Parole.

Interest Forms submitted are valid for two years from date of submission. After this time period, a new form must be submitted to remain active on the interest list.
